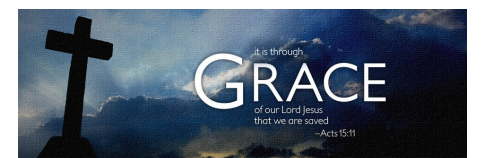
Armstrong led women to unite in missions endeavors that continue on to this day.

Thanks with much appreciation to Andy Wagner who set up the website and Jesus Loves Me Childcare for financing the majority of the cost for the first year.

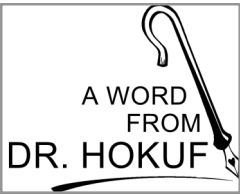




60 BLESSINGS

Prepare, pray, & persist in teaching your child

Editor's Note: Here's some tips for parents, from Diana Davis, an author, columnist and minister's wife, to make your Sundays less stressful. Even though childcare is available for our services, children are occasionally in part or all of the worship service/s and these tips may prove helpful.

“I could have no greater joy than to hear that my children are following the truth” 3 John 1:4. Christian mom and dad, are you intentionally engaging your child in true worship? Here are some ideas that may help:

- ♦ Commit to God today that you'll prepare, pray and persist in teaching your child.
- ♦ Talk about the worship service during the week.
- ♦ Create a church bag to hold a children's Bible (with pictures if possible), a journal book and a pen or markers (for sermon notes/drawings).
- ♦ Prepare well on Saturday. Lay out your child's clothes, find both shoes, be sure there's food for breakfast, and intentionally get a good night's rest.
- ♦ As you drive to church, show excitement.
- ♦ Arrive early enough to take your child to the bathroom just before church.
- ♦ Allow your child to get his own worship bulletin. Glance at it to explain special happenings today.
- ♦ Be seated before worship begins, selecting a seat near

the front so your child can see and participate well.

- ♦ Teach your child to joyfully participate in every aspect of worship. Help him stand or sit at appropriate times, sing the songs, bow his head and close his eyes during prayer. Let him give an offering and pass the plate. Open the Bible and follow the words with your finger, even if he can't yet read them. Instead of playing, napping or lounging, he'll be learning to worship God.
- ♦ You want your church to enjoy your child as much as your child enjoys church. Teach respect for God's house, and pay attention to your child's activity. Never allow him to be unruly or destructive.
- ♦ Help your child to know the pastor, shaking his hand or speaking to him on Sundays.
- ♦ On the drive home, talk about the worship service. Kids are like sponges, and they're smarter than we imagine.

Operation Christmas Child

Children tell their stories

From a 12 year-old boy: “My mother was an alcoholic, who would spend all of our family’s money on alcohol instead of food. We often went hungry. One day, a [The Greatest Journey] TGT teacher [Operation Christmas Child] offered to let me live with her family. I later received a shoebox and went through the TGT course. I accepted Jesus as my Savior and



was baptized. I was so happy because I realized that I had nearly lost my soul. At the end of the TGT class, I asked my mother if she could stop drinking and she acknowledged how wrong her behavior and been. She later accepted Jesus as her

Lord and personal Savior and gave up drinking. We now live in a happy home, attend church services regularly, and pray together.”

A box recipient shared, “I always wanted to have colored pencils, pens, and a pencil case. I thank Jesus for giving them to me. Before getting saved I used bad language and would steal food. Now, I am a new creation; I have given my life to Jesus and I am completely changed. The 6th lesson in TGT really touched my heart and I will never forget the memory verse ‘suffer the little children to come unto me, and forbid them not.’ Jesus really loves children.”
