The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering is an international missions offering which supports Southern Baptist missionaries as they share the Gospel overseas. The offering represents 59 percent of International Mission Board's total income, and every penny you give to the offering goes directly to support missionaries. As Southern Baptists provide more resources, greater numbers of missionaries can be sent.

As of March 2014, **it costs an average of \$50,800** a year to support an individual missionary. This support includes housing, salary, children's education, medical expenses, retirement and more.

Purchase and wrap the item(s); place the gift tag(s) (bottom portion of angel tag) on the wrapped gift(s) and place the same under the Christmas tree (rear of the sanctuary). ALL gifts are due by Sunday, December 22.



We have completed our community outreach that I was telling you about last month. After sending out 7,690 postcards to every household in our zip code, we went out and knocked on doors in our community. One



dozen persons were involved in that part of our outreach. We were able to distribute 310 "bags of blessing" that Saturday, October 24th! About a dozen youth helped assemble each one of the bags ahead of time, too. Over the last several weeks we've had about 20 visitors come as a result of this effort. Let's pray that many more will read the gospels of John and gospel tracts that we distributed.

God promises that His word "will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:11). Jesus says when we share the gospel with people it is like sowing seeds. Some seed falls on the road, or in the weeds or in rocky ground and bears no fruit. But some seeds will fall on good ground. They will grow and produce much fruit, some 30, 60 or 100-fold (Matthew 13:1-23). The Psalmist says, "He who goes out weeping,

carrying seed to sow, will return with songs of joy, carrying sheaves with him" (Psalm 126:6). These verses, and others like them, give us great encouragement.

Concurrently with these efforts I have been preaching a special series of sermons on things we need to know about the future. Pray that God will bless all of these endeavors. One of the messages on Israel sparked some interest in a trip to the Holy Land. Would you like to go?! Right now I am putting together a group to go May 24-June 3rd an 11 day tour. If you would like to go along let me know. The cost is \$4,145.00 from BWI airport. Rev. David Hall, former pastor for 25 years of Oak Grove Baptist Church, is hosting this tour. On Sunday evening, November 29th @ 6pm he is coming to show us some pictures of the various sites in Israel that we will be visiting. I hope some of you may be able to go along.




