arly in April, Bobby and I had the privilege of attending the Global Connect Conference in Orlando, Florida. This was sponsored by Samaritan's Purse in celebration of Operation Christmas Child. There were close to 4,000 people in attendance, with 129 countries being represented. The first evening was so uplifting as we had a parade of nations, with representatives carrying their country's flag. We were blessed with wonderful music (sung in

five different languages), great speakers and a vibrant children's choir from Uganda. Some of the highlights of the conference were the testimonies of young adults who received shoe boxes as children. It was so inspiring to hear their stories and how receiving a giftfilled shoe box made such an impact on their lives.



As we gear up for another year of filling shoe boxes, we want to make you aware of some changes that have been made.

First of all, we can no longer pack candy or toothpaste. These two items have caused problems with customs and as a result have been holding up delivery of the shoe boxes. Since the purpose of the shoe boxes is to bring the gospel of Jesus to the children, it was decided to no longer include these items.

Also, the shipping cost has been raised from \$7.00 to \$9.00. You can include the shipping cost inside your shoe box (checks preferred) or you can pay online and print out your labels. If you use these labels, you will receive an email telling you the destination of your shoe box/ boxes.

Samaritan's Purse has developed a very sturdy plastic shoe box that is now available. Bobby and I have ordered some and will make them available to you. The cost is \$1.50 per box. If you would like to use them, just donate the cost of the box/boxes to our church's OCC fund. We will also have the decorated cardboard boxes available, or you can use any shoebox (the lid wrapped separately from the bottom). Please use regular size shoe boxes and not boot boxes.
