### TWENTY FIVE YEARS OF OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

his past March, Bobby and I had the privilege of attending an OCC conference in Baltimore. It was so uplifting. I believe my favorite session included the testimonies of a number of young adults from various parts of the world, who as children had received a shoe box from Operation Christmas Child. Each one had a unique story, of how the simple gift-filled box had impacted their life. At the close of the session they asked to pray for us. One by one, they lifted up their voices in prayer, speaking in their mother tongue. What a beautiful experience that was.



This year marks the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our Operation Christmas Child project. In this time, God has used these gift-filled shoeboxes to share His love with 157 million children, in more than 160 countries. These

simple gifts have equipped local churches around the world to share the Gospel with children who might not otherwise hear the message of eternal salvation found only through the Lord Jesus Christ.

Our own church became involved in 1997, and two years later we became a relay center. We will continue to be a drop off location for the coming year. Collection week is November 12th-19th. However, we would like you to bring in your filled shoeboxes on Sunday, November  $11^{th}$  for a special dedication.

Shoeboxes will be available for you by the first Sunday in October. The shoeboxes are free, except for the plastic OCC boxes. They are \$1.50 each. If you would like to purchase these, just put your money in a church envelope and mark it OCC and place it in the church's offering plate. The shipping cost for each box is \$9. You may include the money in your box (checks are preferred) or you can go on-line and pay that way, and then print out the labels you need. These labels will include a barcode. When the shoe boxes are delivered, you should receive an email informing you of your boxes' destination. Again, we encourage you to pray, pray, pray over your shoeboxes! *(continued on page 2)*

These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

### What you need:

- 4 apples, cored and cut into 1/8" rings
- Large bowl
- Spoon
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- Baking sheets (sprayed)

#### What you do:

- 1. Place apple slices in the bowl. Add cinnamon and sugar. Stir so apples are coated evenly with the mixture.
- 2. Place apple slices on the sprayed baking sheets in a single layer.
- 3. Bake at 200 degrees for two to three hours, until chips are dry but still slightly soft.




