The words in this song can be a good inspiration for us to fill shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child and demonstrate the love of God to children all around the world.

I am continually blessed as I learn what an impact a simple gift-filled shoe box has made on a child.

Just recently I read about a young boy in South Africa, who had been praying for a pair of shoes. He had never owned a pair in his entire life. Occasionally, he would borrow a pair from someone else. Imagine his delight when he received an OCC shoe box and the first item he saw was a pair of red flip flops. He was overjoyed that now he had a pair of shoes all his own! He was amazed and so touched that God cared and had heard and answered his prayer.

Also, there were two brothers in another country, ages 8 and 10, who often had to fend for themselves. Their parents were both alcoholics and were seldom home as they were partying and taking care of their own cravings. The two brothers attended OCC shoe box distribution, heard the gospel and received the Lord as their Savior.

They enrolled in the twelve week follow-up program, "The Greatest Journey." As they progressed, they became burdened for their parents and prayed continually for them. Their parents attended the graduation ceremony held at the conclusion of "The Greatest Journey." There they heard the good news of salvation and both parents prayed to receive Christ as their Savior. Dear church family,

in reetings precious name of our Lord, Jesus Christ. I have just returned from what was the best vacation/ mission trip that I have ever been



on. Janet and I spent several weeks with our daughter Laura PASTOR and family, and I went to India for

a week in the middle of that time. We stayed healthy and returned refreshed. Thank you all for allowing is this privilege, and what a blessing it was.



When I saw the orphanage in India, with 207 boys, I was very impressed. The campus is in good shape and is well maintained, and the boys are very well cared for in every way. I had the privilege of preaching twice each day, through an interpreter. What a challenge that was. But God's Word translates well in any language, and our host brother, Philip Dongre, was very capable and so gracious.

I also had the privilege of preaching at the Boys and Girls Christian Home, about 30 miles away. They have about 225 boys and girls. I was also very impressed with that facility. They are in the process of building a brand new boys dormitory, which should be finished next March. Between the two orphanages, nearly 100 boys and girls opened their hearts Jesus and were proud to acknowledge Him as their Savior. It was a true work of the Holy Spirit, in the hearts and lives of so many precious souls.

I was also able to visit and preach at Grace Bible College, not far from these two orphanages. Our church supports this work as well. There are about 60 men and women preparing for the gospel ministry in India. I was so impressed with their facilities and well. They just finished a 20,000

volume library, with donated books from the United States. God is working in India in spite of much opposition from the devil. India just passed a law this week that makes it illegal to try to convert someone to Christianity. A pastor could go to jail for one or two years for such an offense. Please pray for our brothers and sisters in India.

I returned to France and was able to preach in the church plant that Chris and Laura are working with, in Gisors. The church has 25 to 40 people in attendance, and their discipleship program is working to grow their membership to maturity. Please continue to pray for Laura and Chris, as well as Sophia, Eliana and Seth, as they get settled and learn the language, make friends and reach their neighbors. We never know what an impact our shoe boxes will make. I encourage you to participate in the wonderful cause. When you fill your shoe box(es), be sure it is covered with prayer.

We will have shoe boxes and brochures available to you in a few weeks. They are free, except for the sturdy, plastic OCC shoe boxes. These are \$1.50 each. You can just place the money in an envelope, mark it OCC, and place it in the offering. Of course you may use your own shoe box(es). Just make sure that when you wrap it, that you wrap the lid separately from the bottom.

The shipping cost for each box is \$9.00. You can write a check for this, place it in the envelope provided in the brochure, and place it in your box at the very top. If you are putting together more than one shoe box, you just need to write one check for the full amount. If you prefer, you can pay for your labels online and print them out to tape on the top of your shoe box. These labels have a tracking code on them and when your shoe box is shipped, you will receive an email telling you where your box(es) have delivered.

November 17<sup>th</sup>, is "Dedication Sunday." This is when you need to bring your shoe box(es) to the church. We will have a special dedication service involving our children at this time.
