If you want to join a midweek Bible study, please contact Tim Bayer our youth associate. We get together on ZOOM, every Wednesday evening at 7pm. There are children's resources available through Facebook. Due to copyright rules, you must join our children's ministry page, to access this material. Please search **FBCNE** Children's Ministries. We are trying to do a variety of these sorts of things, to help you and your family through these difficult days. If you have a prayer request, there is a place on our website to do that too. We like to hear answers to prayer, too. Right now, Chris Moyer's grandfather has contracted the coronavirus in a rehabilitation facility in New York. Please pray for his recovery.

Let me close with congratulations to all of our graduates. This is an

unusual time for them. Social distancing keeps us from celebrating, but not from telling you how proud we are of this accomplishment. Madison Wagner is a homeschool senior, graduating this year. She has been taking dual enrollment classes at Cecil College, and will continue attending there in the fall. Jesonnie Wright is graduating from North East High School, and will attend Penn State University in the fall where she will study engineering. FLOURISHING FAITH

t has been a busy month here at Jesus Loves Me Childcare Center, with unexpected turns and speed bumps around every corner! We had no idea where the road was going to take us over a month ago when we agreed to be certified as an Essential Personnel Child Care Center. That road seems to be longer than we all expected or hoped for. Jesus Loves Me Childcare Center opened over 21 years ago to share the love of Jesus and meet the childcare needs of our community and that mission has not diminished!

One of the conditions to being certified to offer childcare as an EPCC was that we would no longer be permitted to receive payments from parents for the childcare we are providing. As of March 30, 2020, the State of MD has agreed to pay the childcare expenses for all essential personnel. What we did not know was that the State would be so backlogged and slow at issuing payments to the nearly 3,700 childcare providers across the state. As of April 27, 2020, we have yet to receive any payments from the state for the childcare we have been providing. We have furloughed several staff and cut hours to meet our new enrollment needs and to be able to pay our staff until payments from the State arrive. Reserves are being depleted with no incoming funds to replace them. It has been a challenge and the barrel is only so deep!

The teachers at JLMCC are amazing! They have rolled up their sleeves and adapted to whatever is thrown their way! Taking temperatures daily before children can enter our building, washing hands every hour, sanitizing and disinfecting our classrooms and all the items in them, countless times per day! It is exhausting work! But they still manage to do it all with a smile, plan and execute educational and fun activities, laugh with and love on the children, and show up the next day to do it all again! JLMCC is blessed to have each and every one of them! Why in the world would they subject themselves to this uncertain environment?

FAITH! That's why we do it! We often throw that word around like grass seed on a bare lawn, praying that it will take root and grow! We need to do more than just throw the word "faith" into our conversation. We must put it into action! It takes water, sunshine, and rich soil to get a seed to take root and thrive. Where do we find those things in our daily lives? The Holy Spirit is our water, helping us to face the challenges of each day. The love of Jesus is our "Son"shine, spilling freely through us to others! And the soil is the Word of God, feeding us with all the nutrients we need to sustain us throughout the day! When we add those things to the seeds we sow, what grows is beyond all our imaginations! At JLMCC, we are learning that this little word, faith, can often be the only thing that gets us through our day! While we rush around trying to meet new license requirements, God is making a way for us to meet them! While we struggle to understand the daily changes in routines and policies, God continues to show us that HE is the same, yesterday, today, and tomorrow! While we see our resources being depleted, God continues to replenish our strength and resolve! Our mission here at JLMCC has not changed! I ask you all to continue to pray for JLMCC and that we stay faithful, giving God ALL the glory for ALL He has done and is still doing!

Finances

The main purpose of this article is to inform our dear First Baptist Church (FBC) family of our current financial status. PTL! We are in good shape considering the current "norm". Church staff continues to be paid and bills are being paid. May God bless all abundantly for their faithfulness in tithing. If you haven't been able to give your tithe/offering, it may be: (1) mailed to the church (2) electronically given through E-giving @ our website, www.fbcne.org, and/or (3) sent to the church through your bank's online electronic pay services.

Again, the church has been managing fairly well; actually much better than perhaps what we expected. PTL! Along with keeping up with our payroll and bills, we were able to send our promised support (\$1,725 total) to 11 missionaries/missions for the 1st quarter of 2020. The Annie Armstrong Easter Offering has received about a third of our \$1,400 goal. As of April 19, we are about \$11,000 behind in our budget; we have spent about \$7,000 more than receipts for the year for which we have used surplus funds from 2019. God continues to bless. Payroll Protection Program (PPP)

Congress passed a bill to help small businesses, including churches. Our church leadership wanted to apply to the Small Business Administration (SBA) for a PPP loan. We applied through our PNC bank on behalf of Jesus Loves Me Childcare Center (JLMCC) <u>and</u> FBC. The process was very complex and the rules seemed to change daily. Everything was done online. We applied for a loan of \$91,502 (27% for FBC/73% for JLMCC). The loan is based on our combined, monthly average payroll for 2019 times 2.5. Our application was accepted by PNC and is waiting in a queue to be sent to the SBA. Then we were notified that the queue would be as far as it would go, as funds rapidly depleted.

Congress passed another bill for further funding. PNC can now send our application to the SBA. PNC bank forewarns us be prepared that our loan may not be granted due to the volume of applications. Chaney & Associates (an accounting firm that serves churches/faith-based organizations) reported that there were 20 million applications for loans the first time around and only 8% of those were granted. We firmly believe and trust that if God wants the church and childcare center to receive the funding, it'll be done because it's HIS WILL.

If we are recipients of the 2nd loan, we must use the funds (for payrolls and utilities) during an 8-week time frame. Unused funds MUST be returned. We can apply to get the loan forgiven, which would make the loan a grant (no payback required). We'll need to keep good records to substantiate the use of funds.

Prayer and support

Your continued prayer and support is needed more than ever during this pandemic, an unprecedented time in the history of our church. In the past, 1 Sunday snow day would set our finances back. None of us can single-handedly fix the problems. We pray, "THY WILL BE DONE", O, LORD."


