It may well be that God is accomplishing things in this crisis that otherwise would not have happened. I believe that. Paul said, "Christ is preached. And because of this I rejoice" (Phil. 1:18). If he could rejoice while unjustly imprisoned and chained for preaching the gospel, we can rejoice in this crisis too. God is working.

We have not been able to have monthly business meetings, but the deacons have continued to meet and serve. We have organized our church membership so that each deacon has a specific responsibility to about 15 families. They should have contacted you by now, so you know that they are your primary contact. Of course, you can and should feel free to call me or Pastor Dan as well. It is just another way to do.

We have not tried to form the nominating committee yet this year. So many things have had to be put on hold, so we implore all of you who have responsibilities within the church to just continue to serve. If you cannot, please let me know. We will try to reinstate various functions of the church as the situation warrants it. Our youth associate, Tim Bayer and his family, have gone to The Southern Baptist Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. We are so happy for him to be able to pursue this next step in preparation for ministry. We will miss you Brother Tim and promise to pray for you. I hope to stay in contact and have him back to preach sometime.

I have been preaching through the book of Philippians this summer. I hope you all have been able to participate with us, either in person or online. If not, we are providing CDs to anyone who requests it. Paul ends this prison epistle with a thank you to the Philippians for their generous offering to support the Lord's work. He says, "You sent me aid again and again when I was in need. Not that I am looking for a gift, but I am looking for what may be credited to your account." (4:16-17). In a similar fashion let me thank all of you who have been able and willing

## LOVE IN A SHOE BOX

This year, 2020, has certainly been a challenging year. It is so different than the world we are accustom to. As far as Operation Christmas Child is concerned, we are committed to collecting shoe boxes and trying to stay as normal as possible. Each shoe box gift becomes a tangible expression of God's love for a child in real need.

National Collection Week will be November 16 - November 23. We would like you to have your shoe boxes here by Sunday, November 15th for a special time of prayer and dedication. First Baptist Church of North East will continue to be a drop-off location for this area. Precautions will be taken, to keep staff and volunteers safe.

We invite you to be a part of this heartwarming ministry. As you pack you shoe box(es), do it with love and prayers. Sending a shoe box is participating in the Great Commission. You are taking the Gospel to the ends of the earth (Mark 16:15.) We also encourage you to include a personalized note and perhaps a photo in your shoe box(es).

We will soon have pre-printed, cardboard and plastic shoe boxes available, or you may use a shoe box of your own. If you do use your own, we encourage you to giftwrap it; wrapping the bottom and the lid separately. Also, plastic shoe boxes, of good (flexible) quality may be used. The brochures, which give you the information you should need, should also be here soon. These include the labels to be taped to the lid of your box, and an envelop for your check for shipping charges. The charge for each box is still \$9 per box. If you are doing more than one box, you can write one check for the full amount. Place the check(s) in the envelop provided (or one of your own envelopes) and place it on the top of your filled shoe box, just under the lid. If you wish (and many of us are doing this), you can pay the shipping online and print out your labels, to be taped to the lid of your shoe box. Each label has a bar code. After the boxes have been processed, you will receive an email telling you where you box(es) have been sent.



Just a reminder, the age groups are as follows:

BOYS - 2-4	GIRLS - 2-4
5-9	5-9
10-14	10-14

(FYI: Boys 10-14 is one of the least packed for age groups.)

If you are interested in volunteering during Collection Week, the times are as follows:

- Monday, November 16 Saturday, November 21: 9am to 4pm
- Sunday, November 22: 1pm to 3pm
- Monday, November 23: 8am to 12pm

This will complete the first step of sending the love of Jesus all over the world. From here, the boxes will be processed at the processing center in Baltimore. Some members have taken part in this step, and have been so blessed by it. (continued on page 4)

From Baltimore, the shoe boxes will be distributed to many different countries, where OCC works with national Christians, to distribute the shoeboxes into their towns and villages. Some of these areas are extremely remote, and it will be the first time the children have heard about Jesus.

It is exciting to learn how God is using these shoe boxes to demonstrate His love to the children and their families. Many lives have been changed because of them, and to know that we can have a part is so humbling.

After a child receives a shoe box, there is a follow-up. They are taught twelve lessons titled "The Greatest Journey," about Jesus and how to share the good news. More than a million teachers world-wide have been trained to lead The Greatest Journey, in their communities.

Join us then, in packing shoe boxes!!

We will still be bringing the fun! Lots of games and play time will still be happening each and every day!

We would ask that you keep out staff, the children, and their families in prayer. Pray that the teachers can find patience and confidence to tackle this overwhelming challenge! Pray that the children will begin to understand the new role JLMCC will be playing and that they focus and cooperate with the new expectations. And pray for the parents, who will be doing part of the Virtual Learning at home, after work, and Dinner, and BATHS, Oh My! It makes me tired just thinking about it!

This has been a year of new things, firsts, and never befores! Face masks, virtual learning, social distancing, quarantine, screenings, and.... the list is too overwhelming to complete!
