OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD - AN ISLAND EVENT



ast November, our church had the privilege of receiving gift-filled shoeboxes for distribution through Operation Child. These Christmas shoeboxes are sent all over the world as a means of spreading Good News of the gospel. Since 1993, more than 186 million boy and girls in over 160 countries have experienced God's love through the power of a simple shoebox.

The remote areas of the Pacific Islands are the latest area to receive shoebox gifts for their children. So far, more than 120,000 children on more than 200 islands have been the recipients of Operation Christmas Child gifts, bringing them much joy and the opportunity to hear the Good News of Jesus Christ.

One event took place in early December 2020 on the small

island of Enubirr. This island, located in the central Pacific between the Philippines and Hawaii, is home to just over 1,000 people. The island has no electrical power and no airport. The only way to reach it is by boat. So early in December 2020, a team of four set sail for Enubirr aboard Cloud Nine, a 57foot ketch. Also aboard were 30 cartons filled with shoebox gifts. It took the team six and a half hours in a rocking boat to cross the sea.

A missionary couple were part of the team that crossed over, and when landed they were greeted by volunteers from local churches who would host the OCC outreach event. After prayer, singing, a skit and a presentation of the gospel, the shoebox gifts were passed out along with the Greatest Gift Gospel booklets. For many children, this was the first gift

they had ever received that was just theirs. One 12-year-old boy was thrilled to receive a soccer ball and pump of his very own. He loved to play soccer. His mother had diligently looked for one but had not been able to locate one. But God knew the desire of his heart!

The most delightful outcome of all was the spiritual fruit that came later. At the end of the program there was an altar call, and 131 children accepted Christ! Even some of the adults came up afterwards and said how much they appreciated the message. The missionary team will be following up by teaching The Greatest Journey discipleship course. They are excited to see what God will do in the months ahead. They are praying that the children will develop a true relationship with Jesus.
